CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

The Center for Interdisciplinary Studies of the University of Sarajevo (CIS), in partnership with the Department of the Legal Studies, University of Florence, organizes the Sarajevo Summer School 2018 „EUROPEAN INTEGRATIONS: 60 YEARS OF THE ROME TREATY“. The school will take place at the Center for Interdisciplinary Studies from 9-13 July 2018.

All students of the University of Sarajevo, from relevant disciplines such as European studies, Human rights and Democracy, Law, Economics and Political sciences, interested in the European integration processes, willing to pursue a career in this field and have an active role in the EU accession of Bosnia and Herzegovina, are hereby invited to submit their applications. Up to 15 students will be selected on competitive basis. All costs are covered by the Partner Universities. Students who successfully finalize the school will be awarded a Certificate of attendance from the University of Sarajevo.

ABOUT THE SCHOOL

The school is organized within the **RoSaE PROJECT: ROME AND SARAJEVO FOR EUROPE – A EUROPEAN “TREATY” OF AND FOR THE CITIZENS** celebrating the 60th Anniversary from the adoption of the Treaty of Rome in 1957, as a follow up to the **[FLORENCE WINTER SCHOOL 2018: EUROPEAN VALUES, FUNDAMENTAL FREEDOMS AND HUMAN RIGHTS](#)** held from 12th to 16th of February 2018. The aim of the school is to look at the Treaty and its legacy and evaluate its actuality, modernity, perspective of evolution as well as the prospects of historical memory and future vision and the importance of multiculturalism and interreligious dialogue. The school will focus on the origins and the current processes of the European integration as well as its future, through examining the Western Balkan countries.

The School will consist of a series of lectures, institutional and cultural visits. The participants will be maximum 30 students from both the University of Sarajevo and the University of Florence. Students from the University of Florence will be assisted by a supervisor from their home university for the duration of the School.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

RoSae PROJECT is funded by the European Union and Coordinated by the Roma Capitale - The City of Rome; with the participation of the University of Sarajevo, University of Florence, City of Sarajevo, the Istituto di Istruzione Superiore Statale Cine-tv Roberto Rosse and the Indire Istituto Nazionale di Documentazione per l'innovazione from Rome.

The title of the project “RoSaE” recalls at the same time the Latin origin of Rome and the artistic installation called Sarajevo Roses (concrete scars caused by a mortar shell's explosion that was filled with red resin to remember the civilian victims during the siege). Inspired by the experience, past and recent, of the war which concerned both cities, this project aims at promoting the values of the pacific coexistence among peoples in an European perspective, by developing an ideal bridge between the capital of a founder country and the capital of a country having the potential accession candidate status.

The project raises awareness about the importance of the four freedoms introduced by the Treaties of 1957, as well as their essential contribution to the growth of a multicultural, democratic and free Europe where people can live peacefully. In the context of the celebration of the sixtieth anniversary of the signing of the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community, the two cities share the spirit that inspired the Six, the founding states of the EU and at the same time, reflect on the perspective of a revitalization of the project of a European integration.



The Project is Funded by the European Union through the **Europe for Citizens Programme (2014-2020)** whose aim is to **contribute to citizens' understanding of the EU**, its history and diversity, **foster European citizenship** and **improve conditions for civic and**

democratic participation at EU level, raise awareness of remembrance, common history and values **and encourage democratic participation** of citizens at EU level, by developing citizens'

understanding of the EU policy making-process and, by promoting opportunities for societal and intercultural engagement and volunteering.

COSTS & LOGISTICS

All costs of participation in the Summer School such as the participation fee, study materials and lunch for all participants are covered by the Center for Interdisciplinary Studies.
