

Why a PhD in Global Studies?

Global studies are an emerging interdisciplinary area, dedicated to the understanding of the global movements and phenomena that have significant social, cultural, political, ecological and economic consequences. Understanding these phenomena and the current social issues demands an interdisciplinary approach that simultaneously tackles issues in their local, national, regional and global (international and transnational) context.

The "Global Studies" interdisciplinary Doctoral Program offers a unique curriculum for candidates interested in global phenomena such as conflicts, immigration, human rights, gender, religion, political economy, culture and development, from an interdisciplinary perspective.

The main aim of the Global Studies Interdisciplinary Doctoral Program is to broaden the students' knowledge in the area of interdisciplinary research in social sciences, develop the students' research abilities, as well as create future researchers capable of leading interdisciplinary research projects in social sciences. Furthermore, this doctoral program encourages the students' critical thinking and ensures the preconditions for successful and responsible research in accordance with the highest scientific, methodological and ethical standards. The program will equip the students for their further research career in academia, government, or the NGO sector.



The "Global Studies" PhD program provides the experience of intellectual growth and development necessary for accomplished individuals seeking new intellectual challenges after years in a professional environment. The Global Studies program creates novel and challenging interdisciplinary research ideas that provide PhD students with a global perspective of current and complex times.

The PhD program draws on sound methodology in social science and promotes research to consciously shape interdisciplinary social phenomena. Doctoral candidates in Global Studies have a variety of prior experiences and areas of interest. They come from all over the world and their research focus ranges from politics to social development, from project management to cultural and anthropological research ideas.

What are the entry requirements?

In order to be eligible for entry into the program, candidates must hold a master's degree or a minimum of 300 ECTS.

Candidates who previously obtained **360 ECTS** (ie. in a 4-year bachelor and 2-year master program) are not obliged to take elective course. For these candidates, a one-third tuition fee remission applies.

What are the learning outcomes?

Knowledge: Understanding the theory of globalization through the issues of geopolitics, economy and law, or just. Understanding and interpreting the theoretical concepts in the broader area of social sciences.

Skills: Recognizing the social changes and the critical analysis and interpretation of contemporary international relations, problems and challenges. Independent use of scientific research methodologies and the development of analytical skills in global trend assessment.

Competencies: Gaining perspective on global challenges and their influences on an individual's life, environment, economic changes, justice, institutions, technology and other spheres of the modern world. Planning and anticipating global movements on the level of state and organization. The ability to formulate, implement and present quantitative and qualitative research.

What is the structure of the Program?

The Global Studies Interdisciplinary Doctoral Program in Social Sciences operates on a structured semester system, enrolling a new generation of students every two years. After each year, students present their progress at the PhD days, usually held in June.

In **the first semester**, students undertake three compulsory courses, accumulating a total of 30 ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System) and engaging in 105 hours of contact classes.

In **the fifth semester**, students focus on creating a working version of their doctoral dissertation, investing a total of 200 hours and accumulating 30 ECTS.
